

## Horse Camp Parent Information

- **Please have your participant bring a beach towel or mat to eat lunch on.**
- Participants forms will be required for all campers (different from Registration form). If you have already submitted forms, thank you. We will have blank forms for you on the day of, but if someone else is bringing your child to camp, be sure to have the paperwork with them. - Be sure to pack lunch, a towel or mat for them to eat lunch on, lots of water, sunscreen and have your camper wearing long pants and covered shoes. The water at our facility is safe to drink. If they run out of water please encourage them to refill their bottles.
- If your Participant is in a week long camp, Wednesday afternoon is Waterpark Wednesday! Participants will get to play in water tanks, a slip n slide, water guns and more! Be sure to have them wear swim clothes under their riding clothes and maybe bring an extra towel.
- Directions to THH: [www.thhwaimanalo.org/location](http://www.thhwaimanalo.org/location) -- we do not have a street address and there is a gate that needs to be opened (**and closed! Sometimes horses are loose in the field**).
- Parking on the Makapu'u side (gate end) of our facility near our minivan is available and eliminates the bottleneck in front of the barn. Please do not drive on any other grassy areas or in the area in front of the barn.
- **PLEASE OBSERVE THE 5 MILE PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT INSIDE THE POLO FIELD.** We have had two of our barn cats and a dog run get over by cars in the driveway and though we have not had a child get hit by a car yet, it has been close so someone might yell at you if you are going above that.
- Drop off time is between **8:15 and 8:30 am**. Please do not arrive before 8:15. Pick up time is 2:30 pm.
- Please remind your camper that Horse Camp is not like other activities due to the size and inherent danger in large animals and following the rules and direction of camp staff at all times is required. **If campers are not able to follow directions, they will be sent home for their own safety and the safety of others.**
